## Teen-ager denies escape charges

motor vehicle before town of Deerfield Justice Walter Loin.

Authorities said Kingsley had returned to the center for wayward youths yesterday after his alleged escape on July 30. He was taken into custody by state trooper R.F. Soluske of the Sylvan Beach substation and later turned over to county authorities.

After Kingsley and another youth walked away from the facility on the night of July 30, Kingsley allegedly broke into Dan's Auto Service in the community of Taberg and stole a car, officials said.

The vehicle was driven to Syracuse where it was recovered yesterday by local police officers in the parking lot of a bakery.

Probing the incident were Oneida County sheriff's department investigators Enrico D'Alessandro and Gary Clayton.

## Farmer dies in accident

## BOATER DROWNS ON ONEIDA LAKE

CLEVELAND — Michael Sterow, 32, of Gladwin, Mich., drowned on storm-swept Oneida Lake yesterday when he and two other men went to retrieve a boat which had broken loose from its moorings.

State police said Sterow was told that the boat had begun to drift away during a thunderstorm and he and the other men went into the lake after it. Waves at the time were four to seven feet high, troopers said, and Sterow was swept away.

His body was recovered about an hour later. The other two men managed to return, uninjured, to shore near this Oswego County community.

## Jobless rate declines

ALBANY — Unemployment rates in Jefferson and Lewis counties declined in June, while the jobless rate for St. Lawrence County climbed, the State Labor Department announced yesterday.

Jefferson County's unemployment rate dipped to 6 percent, down from 6.6 percent in May and the 7.4 percent rate recorded in June, 1978.

There were 40,700 persons listed as employed in Jefferson County during the month, 2,200 more than the previous month and 2,700 more than a year ago.

Unemployment was listed at 2,600 persons, down 100 from May and 400 fewer than the June, 1978, totals.

Lewis County's unemployment rate fell from 7.1 percent in May to 6.4 percent in June, the Labor Department said. That compares with a 7.8 percent figure a year ago.

There were 10,900 persons carried on the employed rolls, 500 more than the May totals and 700 above the June 1978 tally.

Only 700 persons were listed as jobless in Lewis County in June, 100 fewer than in May and 200 fewer than a year ago.

In St. Lawrence County, however, the unemployment rate climbed to 8.1 percent, up from 7.2 percent in May. That total, though, was still lower than the 9.5 percent rate in June, 1978.

Employment fell to 40,500, down 600 over the month, but up 1,600 over the year, while the number of unemployed, at 3,600, was 400 greater than in May and 500 fewer than the June, 1978, totals.
