Utican, 27, Drowns Swimming Barge Canal Near Sylvan Beach

Channel Swim Is Fatal to Frank Lorenz

SYLVAN BEACH — Frank Lorenz, 27, of 1666 Lincoln av., Utica, drowned in the Barge Canal last night in sight of a Utica friend at whose camp he was spending the day.

State Police reported Lorenz came from Utica to stay with Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Gardner and Miss Antoinette Lupinski, 1219 City st. The woman owned the camp where Lorenz was spending the day.

LORENZ STARTED to swim the 75-yard channel from the south end of the canal to the state dredge, moored on the north side near the Sylvan Beach tower at about 6:55 P.M. Miss Lupinski was on shore.

With about 20 feet of the dredge, Lorenz was seen to throw up his arms, roll on his back and sink from sight. State troopers were notified within a minute and three boats with dragging irons put out from shore.
